School tours begin in November at Sooke Region Museum

Tours are held over a 2 week period:

November 7, 8 and 9th

November 14, 15, 16 and 17th.

There are 2 time periods to choose from. Tour length is 60-90 minutes:

Morning 9:30 A.M.

Afternoon 1:00 P.M.

The program includes:

- A- Tour Moss Cottage, one of Sooke's oldest standing buildings. You will visit with "Aunt Tilly", portrayed by museum staff, in 1902 as she takes you through her historic home.
- B- Hands-on activities that include, making bannock over an open fire and churning butter the "old fashioned" way! These activities take place in our covered and heated outdoor learning facility where the children can enjoy their small snack around a warm fire (Please advise us of any allergies so we can make alternative snack arrangements).
- C- Exploration and Scavenger Hunt of the museum's natural and historic exhibits that include T'Sou-ke Nation History, Maritime History, Pioneer Times and our very own All Sooke Days: a tribute to Sooke's logging history. This portion is self lead by teachers and chaperones.

Cost is \$4 per student - Chaperons are Free
